This Weekend in the past....

March 28

1816 : Reports that Captain Moonlight, another of the agrarian secret societies, active in Kilnacrandy.

1901 : Belfry erected on Wells church.

1937 : Four arrested in the village for selling Easter lilies without permit.

1964: Rumour that John Lennon and George Harrison were staying in Dromoland. They failed to turn up at Point-to-Point. They did carry out a mock duel on Dromoland lawn on day of departure. Their wives, dressed as chambermaids and placed in laundry baskets were smuggled to the Airport in a van.

March 29

1933 : Technical Education under auspices of Clare VEC introduced. See 20 March.

1999 : Robbery at Texaco Filling Station on the Ennis Road
