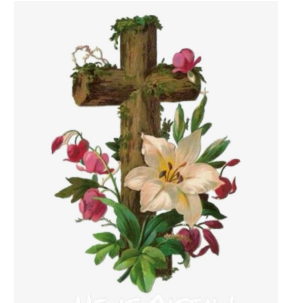

Because 2020 has been a year like no other, the Diocese of Killaloe, in collaboration with the Anglican Diocese of Limerick, Killaloe & Ardfert, has decided to hold a **Day of Remembrance** on November 20th for those who have died in 2020. This Day aims to acknowledging those who have died this year and those who have been bereaved through the death of loved ones. It includes the remembrance of those who have died as a result of the global pandemic, as well as those who have died from other causes during the year. The day will help us to remember our own beloved dead but also acknowledge and pray for those whose passing and mourning has been so cruelly affected by the COVID protocols in hospitals and nursing homes and around funerals.

- A short radio message and blessing from Bishop Fintan and Bishop Kenneth Kearon (Church of Ireland) will mark the beginning of the day's prayer. (This will also be available on diocesan and parish websites, on Facebook and other social media platforms).
- A Diocese-wide moment of silence and individual prayer at 12 noon to remember the dead and bereaved. The angelus bell will be a reminder of this moment.
- **People are invited to light a candle and place it in the window in the evening as an act of remembrance**

Remembering Our Dead

Our Annual November Mass will take place on Friday next the 20th November at 7pm in Newmarket Church. This year the mass will also coincide with the Diocesan Day of Remembrance. We will pray for our loved ones who have left us this past year and for those who are grieving their loss. The names of all those who passed away in our parish will be read out on the night and a candle will be lighting in their memory.

Unfortunately in line with health guidelines we cannot attend in person this year but the ceremony will be live streamed via webcam on the parish website or you can listen in on the radio 97.9fm.

Newmarket - On - Fergus Community Forum Update

We recently ran a community wide survey which was designed to capture the positives and negatives of life in the parish of Newmarket -on Fergus and your suggestions for improving life in our community.

We are just beginning to analyse the results of the survey. The final number of responses was 247 which is one of the highest rates of response by a community that Clare Local Development Company (CLDC) have experienced. We also did very well in the range of age groups represented. This is very encouraging and we thank you once again for your interest and support. The high response rate will help ensure that the views and suggestions received are the best representation of the views of the people of the parish

A great deal of information has been gathered as part of the survey and we are just beginning to collate the priorities that you have identified and suggested actions.
