Christmas:

In the modern christian calendar the Birth of Jesus is celebrated on 25 December. There is no historical evidence that he was born on 25 December. There is evidence that the feast was celebrated in Rome before 336 AD. Around the same time the birth was celebrated in the eastern churches on 6 January, now the feast of the Epiphany. By 400 AD, 25 Dec was the date in western Europe and was gradually accepted in the east.

The winter solstice was chosen to replace a major pagan feast that was held at the winter solstice, the feast of dies natalis Solis Invicti (the birthday of Mithra, the god of the invincible sun). The pagan priesthood (druids) warned the people that their prayers and sacrifices necessary to bring back the sun, the sustainer of all life. The prayers and sacrifices of the druids were always successful. The feast of Christmas gradually took over as Christianity became the official religion of the Roman Empire. It quickly developed in liturgical importance; from a memorial feast remembering a historical event it became a mystery feast celebrating the Mystery of the Incarnation (the Son of God becoming human). For centuries it was the only feast that had three masses; midnight, dawn and morning.

Other customs grew up around the feast: during the week before 25 December there were three fast days, abolished mid twentieth century: the Christmas Crib was introduced by St Francis of Assisi in 1123 AD: the Christmas tree had a German origin in Strasbourg 1605 AD and was based on the Paradise tree adorned with apples on December 24 in honour of Adam and Eve: the candle lit in the window was the symbol of a house where Mary and Joseph would be welcome: the exchange of gifts, associated with different days in different countries during the Christmas season, may go back to a pagan custom of exchanging gifts on 1 January.
