## Hearing Happening Hoping: Lenten Reflections on the Word of God

As well as the theme of repentance, the season of Lent is a reminder of our own Baptism and our own hunger to be rejuvenated in our faith. A great way of living Lent is to give some time to reflection and listening to God by spending time with the Word of God. **Hearing Happening Hoping** is a resource to help us to do this. It is a simple approach to reading the Word of God focused on the Lenten Sunday Gospels. It is written with a group in mind but can also be used individually by anyone interested in the Scripture. There is a page for each Sunday of Lent which is now available for download on the Diocesan Web Page, <a href="www.killaloediocese.ie">www.killaloediocese.ie</a> The website also includes an explanatory page to help you get started. The **Hearing Happening Hoping** resource is ideal for reflection and prayer as we journey towards Easter.


