Leading eco-theologian to speak at Knock

Knock Shrine is holding a day conference with leading thinker and writer on eco-theology, Fr Sean McDonagh SSC, Sat 14th Nov.

Fr McDonagh is known around the world for his work to promote environmental justice and sustainable development and he advised the Vatican on the first draft of *Laudato Si'*, *Pope Francis' ground breaking encyclical on the environment published earlier this year*.

A Columban priest and missionary, Fr McDonagh began his pioneering work on environmental issues in the 1970s, while working with the indigenous T'boli people on the island of Mindanao in the Philippines. Since then, he has become a leading campaigner and has lectured all over the

world on issues such as global warming, genetically engineered food, water pollution, extinction of natural environments and the dangerous impact of modern patterns of production, distribution and consumption. He has published several books and won a Partnership for Global Justice Award in 2011. *Laudato Si'* is the second Encyclical from Pope Francis. It was published earlier this year and was widely recognised as one of the most keenly anticipated papal encyclicals of modern times. It deals with issues such as climate change, pollution, the exploitation of nature's resources, poverty, and social responsibility. The conference is an excellent opportunity to hear from a leading expert in this area. It takes place at St John's Rest & Care Centre, Knock Shrine, at 10am on Saturday, November 14. Note to Parish from Trócaire re Lent 2016 & Jubilee Year of Mercy: r long Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy will

The year-long Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy will begin on **8th December 2015**. Throughout this Jubilee year, Parishes and individuals will be invited to become "*Merciful like the Father*" through joining in the celebration of specific highlights in the church calendar in communion with Pope Francis and Catholic communities across the world. Alongside these celebrations, efforts will be made to offer concrete signs of God's Love and Mercy to our neighbours in need, both locally and globally. Trócaire is committed to working alongside parishes in Ireland throughout this forth-

coming year of Mercy. Indeed, the word "Trócaire" comes from deep within our Irish Christian culture. It can mean "mercy" or "compassion", but it goes beyond that. It also expresses solidarity, embracing Jesus' mission, his suffering with humanity and his active ministry to the poor and excluded. It is expressed in the work of peace, development and justice. And, most importantly, it is a call to action. On the second week of January 2016, five weeks into the 'Year of Mercy', your parish will receive its "Lenten pack" from Trócaire. Included in this year's pack is a Lenten Catechetical programme entitled "Rediscovering Mercy". This is a four week programme aimed at creating a space for reflection on how mercy is both experienced and expressed in our lives, in the Scriptures, in our Church and in the work of Trócaire. The course consists of four sessions, run over four consecutive weeks. While it may be ran at any time throughout the year of mercy, it is particularly suited to Lent or Advent. God's mercy shown through history and to us in our own lives is something worth reflecting on. Without a deep and intimate sense of this mercy, a personal relationship with the God of love becomes very difficult. "Rediscovering Mercy" with Trócaire is a programme that brings participants into a space to rediscover God's love for them.
