One of the challenges facing us as a diocese is that of creating and sustaining Christian communities against the backdrop of fewer priests and a falling off in church attendance. We do not have enough priests to serve in all parishes in our diocese right now and even fewer into the future. The advise coming to us and to many parishes is that we cannot maintain indefinitely the level of weekend services in terms of Masses that we have managed to do until now. Our Parish Pastoral Council has been talking this through for quite some time. The general consensus is that now is the time to let go of two weekend Masses in the parish. It has been decided that from September 2nd / 3rd the weekend Mass times will be as follows:

Saturday: 6.00pm in Carrigerry Sunday: 9.00am in the Wells Sunday: 11.00am in Newmarket

Change such as this always brings inconvenience to many. We will observe for a few weeks how this change is progressing and, if necessary, tweak it a little. Hopefully we can manage to adjust as best we can until a new normality is established.
