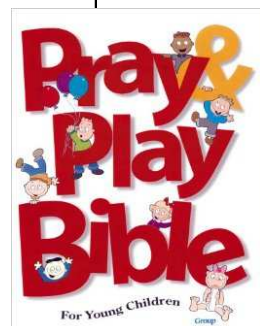

There has been a very steady improvement and an overall 42 mark increase since 2011 These marks are not easily achieved and great credit is due to all involved from the dedicated committee and volunteers to the employment scheme personnel, schools, community and sporting groups, business owners and residents who present their premises so well.
