#### Reflection on Mary the Mother of God



By now I may have a little more time to sit quietly and contemplate the scripture passage the Church has chosen for me on this first day of the New Year. Slowly, I take a few deep breaths, come to quiet and read the text of the Gospel in my Parish Newsletter. Who or what draws my attention in this story? Maybe it is Mary, the one who has been so actively involved in the story and yet from whom we have not heard a word. I consider her situation silently for a while, perhaps bringing to mind all the events which have led to her bringing the baby Jesus to birth.

In time, I may feel moved to speak with her: 'How are you feeling at the moment Mary? Was your labour difficult? How did you feel when you first heard the baby cry?' I listen to her. What does she tell me she treasures? I reflect on what it means to me today to experience these events through her eyes, and thank God for the birth of every child.

With you, Mary, I ponder in my heart the fate of all those who, like you, have been marginalised, not accepted by society: the homeless, the refugee, the mentally ill, the elderly, those suffering with

dementia. I pray that they will encounter the Lord coming towards them in disguise: in food bank volunteers, refuge charity workers, care givers ... Before I go, I thank you, Mary, mother of my God. You are indeed 'blessed among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus'.

#### Obair Family Centre, Ennis Road.

Obair has been in existence in Newmarket on Fergus for nearly 30 years. It is a community social enterprise that works with people from the cradle to the grave to combat exclusion as well as to develop enterprise in the area. We support those who are unemployed or elderly and work to facilitate greater community participation in the area.

#### **Community Creche & After School Programme**

Obair Community Crèche and After School Project continue to provide childcare facilities for children aged between 3 months and 13 year, as well as Post Primary.

**Meals on Wheels:** Obair aims to combat social isolation through the provision and delivery of daily hot meals to older people in Co. Clare. Our 2 course meals are delivered hot from Mon to Fri covering 7 days.

**Tradaree Hub:** Our newly opened Tradaree Hub houses our Meals on Wheels Service and also consists of remote working offices, food start up incubation hubs, a 16 station training school as well as a revamped Youth Space.

### **Community Centre**

Newmarket-on-Fergus Community Centre is located on the Main Street, Ballycar Road.

The facility was founded in 1840 by members of the Temperance Movement to enhance the lives of the residence of Newmarket-on-Fergus and surrounding areas.

The intention was to organise educational, social and leisure activities for the people of the area and reduce the influence of the 'Drinking Houses' which were prevalent.
