On August 25th, a small dedicated local group managed to do the impossible. They recreated sounds and interviews from RTEs pilot community radio which was broadcast from Newmarket on Fergus 40 years ago. An enraptured audience heard the voices of several people who have passed away, bringing back fond memories. There was music, reflections, GAA memories, history and inputs from local committees. As John O'Brien said "Forty years ago our committee had 20 hours of radio to fill. It was a mammoth task, but we were up for the challenge". In fact, RTE praised us as being one of the best local radio stations broadcasted around the country. The reason Newmarket on Fergus was chosen was that a local woman wrote to RTE to complain that all programmes seemed to be geared to Dublin, while the rest of the country was left out. The hardworking group consisted of Mary Woods, Sheila McGrath and John O'Brien. With help from Ger Fahy at the community centre, Michael Talty at the local studies in Ennis and Dominic McInerney at Media Box who transferred the audio tapes to USB. In attendance on the night also were presenters from 40 years ago, Michael O'Leary, Betty McMahon, Joe Walsh and Con Woods.
